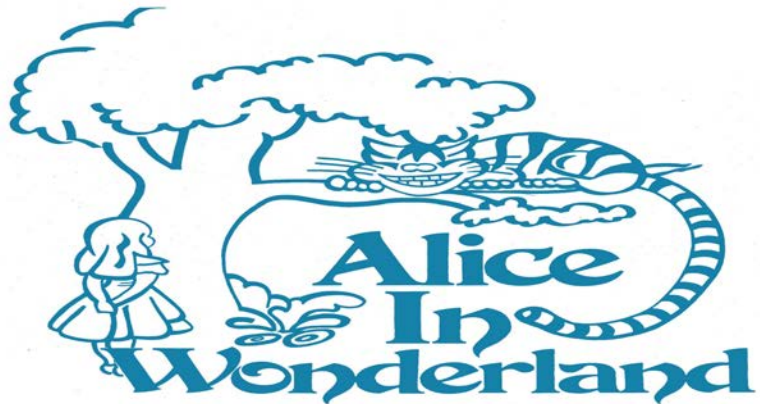

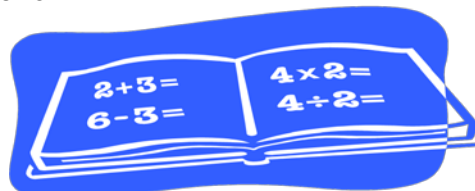
New Students Welcomed

6 ideas to Help your Child Succeed in Math

- **Be positive!** If you have a negative attitude about math, chances are your child will too.
- **Link math with daily life.** Everyday situations involve math such as figuring out the price of an item on sale, estimating or making change.
- **Make math fun.** Play board games, solve puzzles, and ponder brain teasers with your child.
- **Learn about math-related careers.** Help your children realize that the school courses taken now and the grades earned will affect their futures.
- **Communicate high expectations to your children and their teachers.** You expect your child to read; similarly, you should expect your child to do math.
- **Support homework, but don't do it.** Facilitate your child's homework by asking questions and listening to your child. The simple act of having your child explain something out loud can often help figure out the answer.
