Pangman Co-op Celebrates 75 Years

On Thursday, April 7th, 2011 the Pangman Co-op held its 75th Annual Meeting. About 100 people attended the supper of Kentucky Fried Chicken at 6 pm and the meeting which followed at 7 pm.

Don Gurskey chaired the meeting. The Pangman Co-op was presented with a plaque from the Federated Co-op. Monica was presented with a ring for her 15 years as an employee of the Federated Co-op. The Federated Co-op Limited Delegates donated \$150.00 to Charity Farms. Monica Wilson presented the Retail Manger's Report. Susan Peters presented the Delegates Report.

Mayor Rod Rowland and Chuck Jacques congratulated the Pangman Co-op on their 75th Anniversary.

The official date of incorporation for the Pangman Co-op was April 1, 1936. The Co-op started out in a small building located where the cafe is today. It later moved to the building where the current Post Office is located. Later it moved to the present site of the Service Station. The earliest minutes on record are from 1944. In 2005 the Pangman Co-op opened the grocery store and at 2010 year end the grocery store has a black bottom line before FCL patronage.

A Look Back!

The Pangman Recreation Board was established July 3, 1961. The first project undertaken in 1961 was the beach at the Dam west of town. Red Cross classes started their in 1961 with Penny Kirkland as instructor of 72 students. Swimming classes were held until 1970.

In 1963 it was decided to send out a questionnaire regarding the building of a community centre. The community centre was started in 1964 and the ice rink was ready for skating and hockey in 1965. The first ice carnival was held on February 19, 1966. The Centennial Centre was finished and officially opened in July 1967. The Figure Skating Club was formed in 1969 with Doreen Rainey as the instructor.

The old curling rink that was built in 1952 was donated to the Recreation Board and was operated by them until it was sold in 1975. The Board then decided to build a new curling rink and a larger kitchen. The new curling rink was ready for use in 1977.

The Seniors bought the former M&M Store on Mergens Street for their Seniors Centre complete with shuffleboard, pool table, piano etc.

The hall at the Centre was used by the school as a gym until 1982 when a gym was added to the school.

Many upgrades were done to the Centre since 1980. Due to warm winters, and dwindling population the curling rink was closed and converted to an archery range in 1991.

were hosted in Pangman with the assistance of Ceylon, Khedive and Parry in 1991 and 1995. The Prairie Archers Club was formed after Archery was introduced at the 1991 winter games. An air gun club, Prairie Plinkers was formed after the 1995 games.

Fall fairs were held in Pangman in 1991, 1992, 1993, 1994 and 1996. The Wall of Fame was established at the first of these and continues to recognize the contributions made by community members in the areas of sports, recreation and volunteer community service.

The Recreation Centre is now closed and the Recreation Board is now in charge of the Community Centre on Mergens St. (formerly the Senior's Centre).
